TRANSVAAL AFFAIR. A Connected Story of the Raid of the Boers Outwitted Him.

Two Statements as to the Causes Which Led to the Outbreak. The Demands of the Uitlanders—They Set up a Provisional Government at Johannesburg, but Were Pacified by President Kruger.

LONDON, Jan. 7.—Missing dispatches, delayed in transmission from Johannesburg and Capetown, are gradually reaching this city.

On Monday, December 30, Dr. Jameson's force crossed the Transvaal border, without the knowledge, it would seem, of the Uitlanders of Johannesburg.

The so-called "new government" then sent an ultimatum to the government of President Kruger, at Pretoria.

By this time the news that Dr. Jameson had crossed the border and was in Johannesburg, and his arrival at that place was expected hourly.

In spite of the pacific attitude of President Kruger towards the Uitlanders, the news that Dr. Jameson was fighting his way towards Johannesburg raised such a storm of indignation against the lukewarmness of the provisional government of the National Union.

After moving southward on Wednesday, Jameson's party had to fight hard all night, and when they reached the Viakontstein, which is about six miles from Johannesburg, on Thursday morning, they were exhausted.

According to the best estimates, about 150 of Dr. Jameson's followers were killed, and about 50 were wounded.
