

WITHOUT WATER.

City was in Bad Shape Throughout the Night.

THE THIRTY-INCH WATER MAIN That Supplies the New Reservoir Breaks in Two Places.

A COLUMN OF WATER THROWN Twenty Feet in the Air at the Corner of Market and Seventh Streets—A Torrent of Water and Debris Tears Down Seventh Street and Creates a Panic—An Immense Casting Hurdled Down the Hillside Over Seventy Feet—Narrow Escape of Two Teams from Destruction—Water Works People Repairing the Damage.

Last evening at 5:45 o'clock an accident occurred in North Wheeling that leaves the city without a water supply until probably a late hour this morning.
