## THEY GATHER.

The Bavarian Delegates All Here Ready for Business.

### THE PROGRAMME FOR TO-DAY.

The Convention convenes at 9 o'clock, and the delegates will be welcomed in an address by Mayor Caldwell—Tonight's Big Sommerachtsfest at Mozart Park—A Trolley Ride Around Town this Afternoon.

The Bavarian national convention will meet this morning at the Arion hall at 9 o'clock, and at that time about 100 delegates from all over the country will be present. The visitors began to arrive yesterday, and by this morning they will all be here.

The committee of the local society was kept busy yesterday receiving the delegates and assigning them to their respective headquarters. A number of minor details had to be arranged also which took up some little time.

The eastern delegates, or rather a majority of them arrived over the Baltimore & Ohio at 7 o'clock last night, and were met at the depot by the local members, headed by the Grand Opera House band. They were escorted at once to the Arion hall, where the ladies had prepared a fine lunch and refreshments for them, to which they all did ample justice. After supper an hour or two was spent pleasantly listening to the band concert and talking over the affairs of the society, after which the visitors were escorted to the quarters assigned to each. They were distributed among the various hotels and as many of them came from far distant cities, they soon retired for the night.

Today's programme will begin at 9 o'clock, when President Clemens, of New York, will call the convention to order and introduce Mayor E. F. Caldwell, who will deliver an address of welcome to the visitors. President Clemens will reply on behalf of the society.

Business will then occupy the time until noon, when the delegates will sit down to a banquet prepared by the lady relatives of the members of the society. The afternoon will also be devoted to business until 5 o'clock, when the members and friends will march to the corner of Twentieth and Market streets, where they will take the electric car for a ride around town, and to Mozart park, where the sommerachtsfest will take place to-night. As will be seen the above fine programme embraces the local singing societies and the Martin's Ferry society, under the direction of Prof. Hermann Schockey.

The parade on Thursday promises to be a large one and the trades display feature a fine one. The society requests all merchants who intend to be represented in line, to send in their reply to the committee's circular at once, that their wagons may be assigned a place in the line.

### Thieves on the South Side.

The bids for the erection of the new county hospital in connection with the county library were opened by the commissioner yesterday, and the contract was awarded to D. H. Walters, whose bid was the lowest, \$2,311. Two other bids had been received ranging all the way up to \$3,850. The work on the new structure will be begun at once.

### Mogulian Bungle.

Nearly all arrangements have been completed for the Bungle and Outing at Mozart park on the 22nd inst., and there will be more fun than a half dozen monkeys. The outing will be inaugurated with a grand trolley parade on Friday evening next, and every J. A. in good standing is entitled to ride. They must report at the hall in full uniform at 8 o'clock sharp.

### ON TO CLEVELAND.

Knights of Pythias to Leave Next Sunday for the Encampment.

The Knights of Pythias are making great preparations for their trip to Cleveland next week, and it now looks as though one train would hardly accommodate all who have expressed themselves as having made up their minds to go. The trip is a very cheap one and for this reason alone an immense crowd can be expected to accompany the knights on their trip to the Forest City.

The members of Coeur de Leon and Shanley divisions uniform rank, have been to meet at the Ohio Valley lodge room, on Market street, at 9 o'clock next Sunday morning, and headed by Meister's full band they will go to the Baltimore & Ohio depot to meet the delegations from the interior that comes this way to go to Cleveland on the same train with the Wheelingites. The Piedmont, Fairmont, Grafton, Cameron and Benwood divisions will join the Wheeling divisions here and go with them over the Cleveland, Lorain & Wheeling railway, to Cleveland.

Immediately after the visitors have been received the column will form at the depot and march directly to Bridgeport, where the train will be waiting. It will leave as soon as they arrive and will get into Cleveland about four hours and a half later.

The fare for the round trip has been placed at \$1.85, tickets good returning for ten days. The programme at Cleveland includes many attractive features and every day during the stay will be devoted to some entertainment or other arranged by the Clevelandites for the visitors.
