

BUSINESS BAROMETER.

The Wall Street Market Shows Little Change—Comparative Dullness and Irregularity in Prices—The Factions in the Conditions that Prevail.

NEW YORK, Nov. 20.—The Wall street markets show little change from the late comparative dullness and irregularity of prices. Current events do not suffice to stir speculation to activity in the ranks of either "bulls" or "bears," and business is mainly confined to brief professional turns, based upon the varying whims of the moment.

The market differs, however, from its condition of two or three weeks ago, in that it appears to have reached a solid bottom as to values. There are no pessimists with courage enough to attempt large depressions; and equally no "bulls" who think the situation promising to energetic manipulations for a pronounced rise.

There is, however, a factor which is secretly exerting a great influence upon the market than any other, perhaps more than all others combined, but which is comparatively little regarded. The amount of stocks thrown upon the market in the recent great liquidation is probably much greater than has been generally supposed.

NO MORE REQUISITIONS For Fleeing Fugitives from Justice—The Governor Powerless in the Matter. Special Dispatch to the Intelligencer.

MORGANTOWN, W. Va., Nov. 21.—A few days ago a complaint was made at the office of Prosecuting Attorney Lazzelle, against William Beals and wife, charging them with grand larceny. Before the officers could apprehend them they left the state and went into Pennsylvania.

This is because of a ruling of the auditor that the costs in these cases cannot be paid out of the criminal cost fund, but must be paid out of the governor's civil contingent fund. The ruling means that any crime may be committed in West Virginia and the offender has only to escape into another state to avoid the penalties of his offense, because all of the civil contingent fund is spent for other purposes almost as soon as it is available.

Tammany in a Charitable Mood. NEW YORK, Nov. 19.—The executive committee of Tammany hall met today and arrangements were made for the annual reorganization next month. After the transaction of this business Richard Croker made a speech in which he asked the committee to subscribe \$20,000 for the starving people of Cuba, and a like sum for the poor of this city.

SCRANTON, Pa., Nov. 19.—Congressman William Connell, in an interview published to-day, makes a statement in relation to the settlement of the Van Valkenburg bribery case. His part, he said, was that of a peacemaker, and he suggested by the wish for party harmony and sympathy with Van Valkenburg's parents and children. He denied the statement that he had consented to cause and pay for a settlement of the cases in consideration of the gubernatorial nomination.
