

THE REUNION.

Finance Committee Met Last Night and Got to Work.

THE COMMITTEE IS SUB-DIVIDED

FOR THE PURPOSE OF COVERING THE VARIOUS CLASSES OF BUSINESS IN COLLECTING THE RE-UNION ENTERTAINMENT FUND—CHAIRMAN RAWLINGS, OF THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE, APPOINTS A PRESS COMMITTEE.

Last evening in the rooms of the chamber of commerce, Hub building, the finance committee for the reunion of the Society of the Army of West Virginia met for the purpose of devising ways and means in accomplishing the task to which it will apply itself.

It was found necessary to raise in the neighborhood of \$6,000 to defray the expense of the reunion. An estimate, giving itemized details, was submitted by Captain Rawlings and approved.

Mr. Spidel, of the committee, kindly donated for the use of the chairman of the executive committee a roll top desk.

Then followed a lengthy discussion regarding the division of the committee into sub-committees in order to facilitate the complete covering of the field in the collection of the funds necessary.

The manner of procedure was next discussed. It was first suggested that printed blanks that would be in effect promissory notes be used.

The time of beginning the solicitation of funds then came up, and the unanimous sentiment was that it would be best to begin work along that line not earlier than April 15.

The committee adjourned to meet again at the call of the chairman.

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SIN IS REBELLION Against the Law of God as Evidenced by Conscience.

ELOQUENT SERMON PREACHED LAST EVENING AT ST. JOSEPH'S CATHEDRAL BY REV. FATHER PRICE, OF PITTSBURGH—A LARGE CONGREGATION WAS IN ATTENDANCE—SIN HAS BROUGHT DISORDER INTO THE UNIVERSE—THE LESSON OF THE PRODIGAL SON.

The Rev. John Price, of St. James' church, Pittsburgh, preached at the Lenten services in St. Joseph's Cathedral last evening. The subject was "Sin."

The reverend gentleman began by stating that the first requisite to a hearty sorrow and detestation of sin was a clear and dispassionate understanding of the malice of sin.

Sin was rebellion against God's law, as evidenced by conscience and Scripture. Conscience is the oracle of God. Scripture God's written law. Sin was rebellion against God's mastery.

Sin forces other creatures made for the use and benefit of man, and for God's glorification, to fall in their mission by abuse and desecration. Sin also is ingratitude to a father.

One reason why God hates sin is because it attacks His own infinite holiness. Did God permit sin to enjoy immunity, he would accord it rights equal to his own—

Another reason is because sin brings disorder into the universe. As no force is ever lost, as psychologists teach, but is transformed into other energies, so a sin of the tongue, or of the body, is written in the universe.

The reverend gentleman then urged the consideration of the text. "I have thought of my ways, and turned my feet towards the testimonies," calling upon the people to turn to God, whom they had offended more through frailty and lack of perception of sin's malice than from the cold-blooded disloyalty, like that of Lucifer, or Adam.
