BRIEF MENTIONINGS.

Events in and About the City Given in a Nutshell.

Grand to-night—"A Cheerful Idiot." The board of education meets this evening in regular monthly session.

Yesterday, in the circuit court, Judge Hervey, Sarah Dolan was granted a divorce from J. T. Dolan.

Last evening, at St. Luke's P. E. church, Island; there was a well attended congregational meeting, at which interesting addresses were made by prominent members of the congregation and by the rector, Rev. Jacob Brittingham.

Yesterday morning, in the police court, Mayor Butts fined the men, Upham or Pease, and Eshner, \$20 and costs each for annoying a lady on Market street Tuesday night. There was general regret that a more severe dose of justice could not be administered.

Yesterday afternoon occurred the funeral of the late Mrs. J. Q. Blowers, from her home on McCallister street, East End. It was attended by the Woman's Relief Corps, of which the deceased was a prominent member. The pall-bearers were members of Holiday Post, G. A. R.

Yesterday, in the criminal court, Harry Volte entered a plea of guilty on three misdemeanor charges, which consisted in the theft of goods, and was sentenced to serve a year in the penitentiary on each charge; also to pay a fine of \$10 and costs and serve one day in jail on his plea of guilty of a misdemeanor on a felony indictment.

Yesterday's Intelligencer told of the arrest of two male creatures for insulting a lady on the streets. Another case of a Wheeling woman being insulted on the streets by a stranger occurred yesterday afternoon. In the second instance the parties are colored. The wife of a respectable colored man was going home along Market street, and when past Eleventh street, she was accosted by a "swell coon," who called to her to stop until he could walk with her. The woman hurried home and the fellow's arrest by Officer Walker soon followed. He gave his name as Charles Stark. He is a member of the "Down in Dixie" company.

Arrested Yesterday in River Boat Houses at Bridgeport. Since early in October the Bridgeport police have been working to round up a gang of burglars and thieves who were known to be working the upper Ohio valley. Yesterday their efforts culminated in the arrest of three men living in boat houses in Upper Bridgeport. There was a man on each boat in charge, James Seeley, Thomas Seeley and another whose correct name is not yet known. The three men were arrested and are now in Bridgeport jail. In the boats were found a large store of goods of various kinds, such as coffee, tea, boots and shoes, razors, knives, cheese, sugar, canned goods, lap robes, etc.

Mr. Rogers, of Brilliant, whose store was entered last September, was in Bridgeport yesterday and identified some of the goods found in the boats as belonging to him. The men stoutly deny their guilt, but there is no doubt of the ability of the police to prove their case.

The A. O. U. W. Lectures.

The third of the series of lectures under the auspices of local A. O. U. W. lodges was given last night by J. Eldridge Butler, the Kentucky orator, to the members and friends of Welcome lodge. Owing to the smallness of Monday night's audience, Mr. Butler repeated his address of that evening last night.
