The local florists are enjoying a greater bulk of Christmas trade this year than ever before, and the historic holly and mistletoe are hardly equal to the demand.

Few people know the whenceness of the sprigs of holly or the boughs of mistletoe, a fact attested by the frequent inquiries as to where these Christmas adjuncts are grown.

A purchaser in search of spruce pine seldom dignifies it by that name, asking rather for "Christmas trees," or "evergreens."

Last but not least of the Christmas greens comes the mistletoe, famous in song and story, and the one theme of which the Christmas poets never tire.

The southern states furnish mistletoe. It grows on the limbs of trees, being a fungus, and its seed is said to be spread by birds.
