In Session at Buckhannon—Wheeling Union Captures Prize. Special Correspondence of Intelligencer.

BUCKHANNON, W. Va., Sept. 26.—The seventeenth annual convention of the Woman's Christian Temperance Union met here to-day.

After the reports of the various committees, a solo was rendered by Mrs. U. G. Young, of Buckhannon. The "Model Union," conducted by Mrs. N. C. Morrow, followed.

Wheeling union received the gavel offered by the state union for holding the largest number of public meetings.

The Orange Free State road continues in secret session.

A telegram from Johannesburg says an American named Blake is raising an American corps of five hundred men for the Boers.

On the Cape side the dispatches show great military activity in the direction of the frontier.

The Kings Rifles are now encamped at Lady Smith, and the Fifth Lancers are arriving there.

The authorities have been unable to overcome the trouble with the Cape drivers, who refuse to accompany the mountain batteries to the front from Lady Smith, which is one of the bases of operations.

An armored train, hurriedly completed at Cape Town, left there at midnight for Lady Smith.

It is reported that the Boer agents have made large purchases of grain at Durban.

The inhabitants of several townships on the frontier have appealed to Sir Alfred Milner, the British high commissioner in South Africa, to send them military protection.

A dispatch to the Fall Mall Gazette from Cape Town reports evidence of unrest among the Griquas and Pondos, and a section of the Bechuanas and Matabeles.

The war office has ordered the whole transport and supply for an army corps to be prepared to proceed to the Cape.

This is a very important order, and implies the early dispatch of an army corps.

The men of twenty-five companies are being medically examined at Aldershot to-day.

The Currie line has just received an order from the admiralty to prepare the Braemar Castle, of that line, to sail for the Cape October 6, with 1,400 officers and men.

This is an entirely fresh batch of troops, and the composition of it is unknown.

The Currie line has been compelled to cancel its passenger list which was made up, and workmen have been sent to transform the Braemar Castle into a transport.

In spite of these warlike preparations South African circles in London still believe there will be no war, and that the Boers will finally concede the British demands.

ARMY OF CUMBERLAND

Scope of Next Year's Reunion Will Be Considerably Extended. DETROIT, Mich., Sept. 27.—It is probable that the scope of next year's Army of the Cumberland reunion at Chattanooga, will be extended so as to include a general reunion inclusive of the societies of all the great armies of the civil war.

While no definite action was taken to this end at to-day's final business session of the army of the Cumberland, the society's officers are directed to endeavor to bring the project about. The selection of Chattanooga for an event of that character is regarded especially as appropriate since, besides the Army of the Cumberland, the Army of Tennessee, under Sherman, two corps of the Army of the Potomac, under Schofield and Burnside, all had some part in the Tennessee operations.

Congressman Henderson, prospective speaker of the house of representatives and a prominent member of the Army of the Tennessee, was elected an honorary member of the Army of the Cumberland, and also vice president for his recognition of his services in behalf of the National park at Chattanooga.
