So Says the Millionaire's Pittsburgh Representative to the Wheeling Library Committee—Good Prospects for Ultimate Success.

Mr. William P. Campbell, of this city, who made the suggestion recently that Wheeling make an effort to secure a donation of \$50,000 from Andrew Carnegie, the millionaire philanthropist, for a public library building in this city, returned last night from the Smoky City, after having had an interview with Mr. Carnegie's representative, Mr. W. N. Frew. The letter of the special committee of the Wheeling board of education was handed to Mr. Frew, who stated in reply that applications for library donations would have to be made direct to Mr. Carnegie. The latter, he said, would be in New York about the middle of November, when it would be opportune to make the application. Mr. Campbell will report to the board's committee to-day, and it is likely a direct appeal will be made to Mr. Carnegie. Mr. Campbell believes the prospects are good for success. Only a few days ago a donation was made by Carnegie for a library building in Duluth, Minnesota.
