Discredited State Democracy.

Ex-Governor MacCorkle, although shut out of the temporary and permanent chairmanship of the Democratic state convention, at Parkersburg, had published in the state papers a speech he had in his pocket to deliver, but which was never spoken.

It is true the appropriations amounted to about \$600,000 more than those of the Democratic legislature of 1892, but the appropriations for the years 1892 and 1894 were insufficient to meet the demands of the public service.

The appropriations of the last legislature, unlike those of the former Democratic regime, are large enough to defray the expenses of the state, but that is not all. They include large amounts for the construction of new state buildings and repairs of the old ones.
