REPUBLICANS
DEMONSTRATE.

The Martin's Ferry Club Demonstration Last Night Was a Big Affair, and Was

WITNESSED BY THOUSANDS.

Wheeling Contributed 600 of the 1,600 Men in Line—Rough Riders in Action.

The Republican street demonstration at Martin's Ferry last evening, as was expected, far surpassed anything ever seen in Belmont county. It was not only the largest political demonstration, but the largest parade of any description ever witnessed in the over-the-river county. The Republican leaders had the cooperation of all the citizens, and all worked jointly to gain that end. Some of the decorations were magnificent, and much taste was displayed in the arrangement of the national colors. Broadway and Fourth streets were lined with flags and bunting, and the decorations in all parts of the city were elaborate. As soon as darkness approached, lanterns were strung along the line of march, making the marching thoroughfare almost as light as day. The parade, which was scheduled to start at 8 o'clock, began its march on time and consumed thirty-five minutes in passing the business portion of Fourth street. The file was close and compact, and the four divisions comprised about 1,600 marchers, horsemen and people in carriages. The following is the order in which they passed:

The streets were crowded all evening, and were almost impassable. A conservative estimate of the crowd that witnessed the street pageant is placed at 15,000. Large crowds were present besides the marchers from Mt. Pleasant, Colerain, Dillonvale, Titonville and the neighboring cities. Of the 1,600 men in line, Wheeling contributed over 600, the Rough Rider regiment alone having 500 men in line, the best showing the regiment has made numerically. The regiment was in command of Colonel H. B. Baguley, with Lieutenant Colonel Charles H. Geiger, Major George W. Otto and other regimental officers. The Rough Riders were cheered all along the line of march, and were greatly pleased with their reception. Coming down from the Laughlin mill, the upper limit of the route, some "blue-jean" Democrats on the hillside showered stones upon the island and colored Rough Riders, somewhat demoralizing the line, but a halt was called and the entire regiment of 500 men went up the hill-side, very much a la Roosevelt at San Juan. The interspersed took to their heels very wisely, for they would have fared badly had they stayed.
