Oath of Office. The following is a copy of the bill which passed the United States Senate on Monday last, prescribing an oath of office and Cleanse the Blood and Cure the Sick. for other purposes: () 1 1 /

Be it enacted, ic., That hereafter every person elected or appointed to any office of honor or profit under the Government of the United States, except the President of the United States, except the President of the United States, either in the civil, mili-tary or naval departments of the public service, shall, before entering apon the du-ties of such office, and before being entitled to any of the salary or other emoloments thereof, take and subscribe the following path or affirmation 1.12 oath or affirmation : "I, A. B., do solemnly swear (or affirm)

that I have never voluntarily borne arms against the government of the United States since I have been a citizen thereof; that I have voluntarily given no aid, coun tenance, counsel or encoragement to par-sons engaged in arms hostility thereto; that I have neither sought nor accepted, nor attempted to exercise, the functions of any office whatever under any entherity, or pretended authority, in hostility to the Government of the United States ; that I have neither voluntarily renounced my allegiance to the Government of the United States, nor yielded a voluntry sup-port to any pretended government, authority, power, or constitution hostile or inimi-cal thereto. And I do further swear (or affirm) that, to the best of my knowledge and ability, I will support and defend the Constitution and Government of the United States, and all laws made in pursuance thereof, against all enemies, foreign and domestic; that I will bear true faith and al-legiance to the same; that I take this obligation freely, without any mental reserva-tion or purpose of evasion; and that I will well and faithfully discharge the duties of the office on which I am about to enter, so help me God;" which said oath, so taken and signed, shall be preserved among the files of the court, house of Congress, or department to which the said office may appertain.
