The Department Corps will not be entitled to bounty and cannot be paid until Congress makes an appropriation for that purpose.

3rd. Volunteers in the Departmental Corps, may, at their own request, be transferred and mustered into the service for three years or during the war, and upon such transfer and muster they will be allowed the pay and bounty authorized by the Act of Congress to Yolunteers for three years or during the war.

6th. The operations against the enemy are not to 6th. The operations against the enemy are not to be limited by the geographical lines of the Department, but may extend to adjacent territory as in the judgment of the Commanding General may be expedit nt to resist or pursue the enemy.

The following de islone in relation to the assessment of the Income Tax have been issued by the Commissioner of Internal Reveaue:

Each person will be required to return his total income, so far specifying the sources from which it is derived, as to enable the Assistant Assessor to decide what deductions shall be made therefrom.

The income tax must be assessed and paid in the district in which the assessed person resides. The

Income derived from coal mines must be returned, although a tax has been previously paid on the coal produced. No deduction can be made because of the diminished value, actual or supposed, of the coal vein or bed, by the process of mining. Rent derived from coal mines is income.

Premiums paid for life insurance shall not be allowed as a deduction in statement of income.

Pensions received from the United States Government must be returned with other income subject to taxation.

ment must be returned with other income subject to faxation.
Old debts, formerly considered hopelessly lost, but paid within the time covered by the return of income, should be includined in this statement.
Debts considered hopelessly lost on the 31st of December, 1863, and due to the business of the year 1862, may be deducted from the profits of business; if subsequently paid, they must be included in the return for the year in which paid.
In order to give full effect to the proviso to the 91st section of the act of July lat, 1862, respecting the tax on that portion of income derived from United States securities, it is directed that when income is derived partly from these and partly from other sources, the \$600 and other allowances made by law shall be deducted, as far as possible, from that portion of income derived from other sources, and subject to three per cent. tax.
