HEADQUARTERS 4TH REGIMENT V. M. THURSDAY, May 31, 1863.

PURSUANT to General Order No. 4 of Brigadier General James B. Wadsworth, of the 2nd Division, Commandants of companies comprising the 4th Regiment will assemble their respective companies at the time specified in the following order, to be held on Saturday afternoon at 4 o'clock, commencing on Saturday, the 28th instant, and continuing until otherwise ordered:

Company A, Capt. J. W. Ward, on the river at above North street.

Company B, Captain John E. Wilson, on Wheeling Market Street.

Company C, Capt. J. N. Vance, at the City Armory (Court House).

Company D, Capt. C. D. Knox, at Second Ward Market House.

Company E, Capt. W. M. Simpson, on Creek above North street.

Company F, Capt. F. G. Rothacker, at the corner of Market and Jefferson streets.

Company G, Capt. J. C. Thompson, on Centre street, between Sixth and the Creek.

Company H, Capt. John Scott, on Wheeling Hill, to the right of the National Hotel.

Company I, Capt. John F. Hopkins, on Wheeling Island.

Company L, Capt. James H. Holmes, at the Court House.

II. If possible make by ready for distribution in line for the day on Saturday, the 30th inst. Should they not be ready, commanders of companies will employ their time in drilling their companies in the streets and marching, and in procuring correct rolls of persons within their several districts liable for, and exempt from, militia duty, and report the same to the Adjutant of the Regiment on Monday, Tuesday, the 30th inst.

III. All citizens between the ages of 18 and 45 years, residing within the bounds of the 4th Regiment, are required to report themselves to the commanders of the company in the district in which they reside on or before Saturday, the 29th inst., and those claiming exemption for any cause from such duty, will state the grounds upon which their claims are based.

IV. Courts martial will be convened for the trial of all delinquents in discharge of the duties above specified, as well as for the trial of those who avoided duty under the late order of the Governor calling the regiment into active service.
