Slavery in Tennessee

Ask a Union slaveholder what he tinks of the prospects of slavery in Tennessee, and he will reply that he regards it as a doomed institution, and will soon be a thing of the past. Ask a Secession ist the same question, and he will reply curtly that he thinks slavery is going to the devil. The only difference between the opinions of the two men is, that the latter does not make the admission as who is ready to submit to any sacrifice for the sake of his diary sacrifice for the sake of his country. We think then, that if slave-holders will camly survey the field, and watch the irresistible march of events, they must conclude that slavery has ceased to be profitable in this State, and on henceforward be regarded only as a burden and a continual source of irritation and peril. We know that these will be unpleasant reflections to men who are resolute and to give up the semblance of that reluctant to give up the semblance of that power, which they have long enjoyed in reality. The possession of slaves frequently brings many comforts and luxuries to their possessor, at the expense of the growth, prosperity, and intelligence of the commonwealth. If the poet's axiom be true, that "men, high-minded constitute a State," far better would it be to supply the places of a hundred igno rant, degraded negroes, with a hundred intelligent white labourers. In place of one customer, in the person of the slave-owner, the merchant, the printer, the owner, the merchant, the printer, the shoemaker, physician, bookseller, tailor, and blacksmith, would have a hundred customers in the white labourers. The day has passed, however when slaves possess any real value with us. They are the empty shadows of wealth and power, the reality of which they represent as poorly as the straw-crown and fanciful rags of Lear, the lunatic, represent the pomp and splendor of Lear, the king. These, we say, may be unpleasant reflections; but they are necessary ones, which we can not avoid; and the great question we can not avoid; and the great question comes up, whether it is our duty, or our interest, to squander our treasure and best blood for a system which is now both worthless and perilous, or shall we pre-pare to remove it from our midst?
