In Memoriam-Two Sisters.

Miss Minnie, daugter of Mrs. Littia B ack, and the late Wesley A. Black, departed this life October 16, 1901. On the following day, white her funeral services were being conjucted at Little Mountain Pr. sbyterien Church, her sister Miss Sue Estelle, wife of William Kay, quietly fell asleep. Brief sentences! But they tell of pain and suffering, of shadowed homes and sorrowing hearts, of a bereaved mother, of a desolate busband, of apphaned children, of sisters and brothers bereft.

From this time the disease developed rapidly with both, and in a week's time there was little hope of the recovery of either. Mrs. Kays sickness was protracted and painful. Her sister's struggle was brief and attended with little suffering.
