CHRISTIAN CRUSADERS.

In 34 Days 41 Public and Nearly Twice as Many Private Meetings Conducted - Private Missionary Work Done in 370 Homes - One Hundred Professions.

The large audiences which still crowd the Tabernacle of the Christian Crusaders, and the spiritual results that are being brought about in answer to the prayers of the Christian people, indicate that the interest has not yet abated, but is rather on the increase. One hundred persons have professed faith in Christ, and many more are under deep conviction. "The end is not yet."

On last Sunday afternoon General Light gave a Bible reading on the doctrine of Holiness. He prefaced the reading with the following remarks: "For the information and benefit of those who are present at this afternoon, and especially for the benefit and enlightenment of God's children, and more especially for the encouragement and inspiration of those of this number who are hungering and thirsting after righteousness, we will give a carefully prepared Bible reading on the doctrine of Holiness."

"It is probable that not one of the sacred, essential doctrines of salvation, taught in the blessed Holy Bible, is more misunderstood than the doctrine of Holiness. He will abundantly pardon, but he will not pardon unless they are willing to make the absolute consecration enjoined upon them by God, to the subjection of their hearts, minds, and wills, to the service of God, that ye present your bodies a living sacrifice, holy, acceptable unto God, which is your reasonable service.'"

The Roman Catholics claim that all the professed Christians, who die in the faith of God, and who are baptized, are sent to Purgatory. They assert that before the soul can be prepared for Heaven, it must, in Purgatory, go through a certain cleansing and purifying process, the duration of which is determined according to the depth of depravity in which the soul is vested at the time of death."


