NOTES IN LEGISLATURE.

A Bill introduced by Representative Graydon regarding Insurance Companies to pay the attorney's fees of claimants in suits unreasonably defended has passed the House and been sent to the senate.

Several Bills have been introduced in the House providing money for enforcing the prohibition law. It appears that \$50,000 will be appropriated for this purpose.

The Ways and Means Committee of the House and the Finance Committee of the Senate have given notice that appropriations must not be increased over the amounts appropriated last year.

A bill providing for truth in advertising but providing that the newspapers be held liable for damages accruing from false advertisements was killed when the house met again

tonight after a recess of seventy-two hours. The house also killed the resolution to adjourn February 10th.
