THE SUPREME COURT UPHOLDS LEGALITY OF APPROPRIATION FOR IMPROVEMENTS AT ASYLUM.

Columbia, S. C., March 18.—The supreme court has upheld the legality of the appropriation of \$100,000 for continuing the improvements at the State Hospital for the Insane. Members of the Board of Regents said this morning the improvements at the asylum would be rushed forward as rapidly as possible.

The question as to the meaning of certain items of the appropriation act was raised by the comptroller general, who asked a legal interpretation of the part relating to the appropriations for the contemplated improvements at the asylum. The action was lodged in the supreme court, in the original jurisdiction, the proceedings being ex parte. The regents of the hospital were the petitioners and Carlton Sawyer, comptroller general, the respondent.

The opinion reviews the legislative process of the asylum appropriation, and the statement is made that "It can not be successfully contended that the senate amendment struck out item No. 2, appropriating \$100,000 for rebuilding the hospital," and a recapitulation of the items shown, says the opinion in effect, that it was the intention of the legislature to appropriate \$318,000 for maintenance and salaries and \$100,000 for rebuilding," otherwise the item in the

recapitulation would have been only \$318,000. The opinion, written by Chief Justice Gary, is concurred in by Associate Justices Watts, Fraser, and Gage.
