**SAVANNAH RIVER BRIDGE ASSURED**  
(Elberton Star.)

A number of Elberton business men went to Sanders Ferry yesterday and met with committees and engineers from South Carolina who are interested in building a dam across Savannah river at this place. The engineer stated that the cost of building a dam would be eighty thousand dollars at one place and one hundred thousand dollars at another. The estimate is a preliminary one, and is given in round figures.

At the place where the bridge would be the cheaper, it would cost a great deal to build good roads leading to the bridge on either side of the river, while the higher priced bridge would be of easier access. Already forty thousand dollars has been subscribed to building the bridge, which would make the distance from Greenville, S. C., to Atlanta twelve miles less than by Hartwell. Messrs. T. O. Tabor, M. F. Daniel, A. S. Johnson, M. J. Brown, John T. Heard, Z. W. Copeland, C. F. Herndon, C. O. Brown and Raymonde Stapleton were among those who went from Elberton to look over the situation.

## LIQUOR SMUGGLERS REVIVE OLD TRICKS

Buffalo, Jan. 23.—Old tricks are being revived and new ones invented by smugglers who are matching their wits against those of the customs officers in an effort to bring contraband whiskey from Canada into the United States.

The tide of the whiskey movement which for more than two years flowed from the United States into Canada has turned back. Of the same smugglers who once took long chances to send liquor across the border into Canada now are attempting to evade the American instead of Canadian laws.

There has been a partial lifting of the ban in Canada. The order-in-council issued by the Dominion government in wartime which prohibited inter-provisional traffic in intoxicating liquor, was rescinded on December 31.

Ontario still has a dry law prohibiting the sale of liquor across bars or in any way except by government vendor upon an order from a physician. This, Ontario law, however, cannot prevent inter-province traffic by mail and express. Consequently Americans who want to take chances with the customs laws have experienced little difficulty in having liquor delivered at the United States border.

Some of the tricks used to evade detection by Canadian customs inspectors when the movement of liquor from the United States to Canada was in progress were very ingenious. Smart tires on automobiles turned out to be receptacles for con-

traband wet goods. Partitioned gaso-line tanks served the same purpose. A hot waterbottle used by a woman feigning illness was found to contain whiskey. A carload of scrap iron billed from Detroit to Buffalo over the Michigan Central railroad was sidetracked somewhere in Ontario and whiskey was substituted for the iron. The liquor was seized at Buffalo.

Customs officers here expect a revival of these tricks and development of others in order to bring liquor from Canada into the United States. The force of inspections on this side of the Niagara river from Buffalo to Fort Niagara has been increased.

## OUR SOLDIERS WIN ARMORED DUEL

Washington, Jan. 22.—American soldiers attached to the expedition commanded by Major General William S. Graves in Siberia, twelve days ago repulsed an attack by Semenov troops along the Trans-Siberian Railway and captured one of Semenov's generals, six officers and forty-eight men, in addition to killing five and wounding one.

The fight took place at Posopskaya, at 1 o'clock in the morning of Jan. 10 when a Semenov armored car attacked the American detachment of thirty-eight men in their car at that point. The American casualties were one killed and

two seriously wounded, one of the latter dying of his wounds.

A preliminary official report on the fight during which the American troops also captured the armored car of the Semenov contingent, was received by Secretary Baker today, who made public extracts from the cablegram and stated that General Graves had also reported that he believed the matter could be adjusted peacefully with Semenov, who could not have been responsible for the attack.

General Graves's cablegram was sent from Vladivostok on Jan. 21 and the extracts from it made public by Secretary Baker read:

"Semenov armored car attacked detachment of thirty-eight men (United States Army) in their car at Posopskaya at 1 a. m., Jan. 10. Detachment fought and captured armored car, including one general, six officers and forty-eight men, who are still held.

"American casualties, one killed, one died of wounds and one seriously killed and one wounded."

## New Cossack Government

London, Jan. 20.—General Denikine, leader of the anti-Bolshevik forces in southern Russia has formed a new Cossack government with Novorossyck as the capital, according to diplomatic advices received here.
