

**TWO OLD LEADERS WILL BE MISSING**

Washington, May 3.—Two of the reft bigwigs—"Boss" Penrose from the Republican camp and Claude Kitchin from the Democratic tent—will be lacking at the forthcoming convention to be held at Chicago and San Francisco, respectively.

The news of the gravity of Senator Penrose's condition will be a shock to the country generally. Senator Penrose had been a man of such rugged physique that the almost complete breakdown is difficult of comprehension. He is only now in his 60th year, and it was thought when he had to first give up his active duties in the early winter, at which time he took his private car and went to Florida to recuperate, that his power of recovery was so great that he would soon be in harness again as the real boss of Pennsylvania Republican politics, including of course the G. O. P. side of the senate. However, as time has gone on his condition has grown steadily worse with such persistency as to cause grave misgivings as to the future.

The loss of Senator Penrose in the party councils at Chicago will be greatly felt. For the last 20 years he has been a conspicuous and stalwart figure in national conventions with the exception of 1912. That was the year of the big Bull "Moose" split.

**Leaders At Sea**

"Boss" Penrose—and he will never be known as anything else because his power has been equal to that of "Boss" Platt of New York, Tom Reed and other men of gigantic power—has been a member of the national committee since 1904—again with one exception—in 1912. Senator Penrose will be especially missed this year because of the unprecedented conditions existing in the Republican party at this time. Six weeks away from convention time Republican leaders admittedly are at sea both as to candidates and as to platform declarations, while the unity of the party as a whole is distinctly threatened. There never was a time when wise counsel was so necessary to party welfare, and while Senator Penrose may try in earnest manner to give advice from his sick room, the great influence of his presence and personality will be totally lacking.

There is wide speculation here as to what the effect upon the party organization in Pennsylvania will be in the event of Senator Penrose's incapacity becoming permanent. He has been Pennsylvania's big man in Republican circles for so many years that there would be much difficulty in securing a leader to wear his shoes.

It is possible that Governor Sproul

might become the successor to the Penrose rule in Pennsylvania, but he is a man of large business interests and besides does not like to play the political game just for the love of playing it like Penrose has done for many years past.

Under Penrose the Pennsylvania machine has been all powerful and, as stated, it was only in 1912 that he suffered a setback. In 1914, however, he staged a "comeback" which was complete in every respect and which showed him to be a pastmaster in the political game. Since that time his power has been even greater than it was before.

When the Republicans gained control of the senate last year Penrose faced a fight in connection with his natural desire to become chairman of the finance committee—the big money committee of the senate. Progressives in the senate openly challenged him, but when the fight was done Penrose had gotten what he wanted.

Senator Penrose has been a member of the upper house of congress since 1897, succeeding the late "Don" Cameron and for 23 years of service in that body has shown himself through his own efforts and those of his lieutenants—well trained in the art of politics—incapable of admitting defeat anywhere along the line. Thus he has well earned the title of "Boss" Penrose.

**Kitchin Missing Also**

On the Democratic side of the convention, Claude Kitchin, for many years congressman from North Carolina, and a leader in the house, will be missing when the roll is called. Two weeks ago he suffered a stroke of paralysis while making a speech on the peace treaty before the house and although it is possible that he may attend further sessions of the house this year, there is not the faintest hope that his physicians would permit him to make the trip to San Francisco with all the excitement due to the occasion.

**NEGRO SENTENCED BY LANDIS TO 25 SECONDS**

Chicago, May 3.—Twenty-five seconds—one of the shortest sentences on record in Federal courts—was imposed by Judge Landis today upon Jesse Nash, negro, charged with tampering with the mails.

As Nash walked to the courtroom door in custody of a deputy marshal the judge called "Times up!" and the prisoner was released. Nash admitted obtaining possession of letters written by his wife to another man. He exhibited the letters in court, and after reading them Judge Landis fixed the penalty.

**LIVES 6 DAYS IN GLASS BOX HERMETICALLY SEALED**

Cambridge, Eng., May 3.—Joseph Bancroft, a reader of physiology at Kings College here, has lived for six days in a hermetically sealed glass box.

The experiment arose out of a thirty-year-old controversy as to whether it is possible to calculate the amount of oxygen in the blood from a knowledge of the amount of oxygen in the breath. The test also was made to demonstrate whether it was necessary that airmen should have oxygen apparatus when flying at great heights. It proved that oxygen

was necessary to flying men, but it did not show to what height they could fly with safety.

While in the box Bancroft kept a record of his sensations and made scientific observations. He said he suffered from sleeplessness but otherwise did not experience much inconvenience except on the last day, when the atmosphere came extremely rarefied. He then had headaches and nausea. He was watched continually while in the box. He took food and slept in two small compartments fitted up with wicker chairs, a table, a small bed and a bicycle, on which he exercised every morning.

**SANDERS SAYS HE IS TO BE A CANDIDATE**






