### WOMEN ARE CHOPPED TO DEATH.

Negro, Formerly Employed by Farmer, Sets Fire to Barn, and While it was Burning was Caught by Farmer's Wife and Her Servant in Act of Robbing the House, Whereupon he Chops them to Pieces with Axe.

Near Merchantsville, New Jersey, last week Mrs. Frances Horner, aged 67 years, wife of Edward Horner, a farmer, and Mrs. Victoria Napolie, a servant, were chopped to death in their home, it is charged, by Charles Gibson a negro who was formerly employed on the farm.

The assassin first set fire to the Horner barn. While Horner and Mrs. Napolie's husband were trying to rescue some of the horses from the barn Mrs. Horner and her servant came upon the negro in the act of robbing the house. The robber attacked the women with an axe and chopped them to pieces. Mrs. Horner's head was severed and Mrs. Napolie's head chopped in and her body covered with gashes. Horner and Napolie returned to the house to find Mrs. Horner lying in a pool of blood and Mrs. Napolie, who was near by, died soon afterwards.

Two gold watches and a sum of money had been taken from the house, and the police located the watches in a pawn shop in Philadelphia, where they had been put by a negro. The pawnbroker, according to the police, identified the negro. The pawn tickets were in his possession.

Stephen Dorsey, another negro who was with Gibson when, as alleged he pawned the watches, was also arrested, although the police do not believe he had anything to do with the murder.

Gibson, who was discharged by Horner some time ago, applied for work yesterday. He was told that he could sleep in the barn and that he would be given work in the morning. Farmers running to the fire declare that they saw the negro fleeing from the home.

Gibson refused to make any statement as to the murder, but when one of the watches was recovered from the pawn shop and shown him, marked with the name, "Horner," he was asked if he knew to whom it belonged, and replied: "Yes, and I am sorry for him."

He stated that he felt especially pleased to approve the measure and that he felt confident that the people would ratify its provisions when submitted to them at the next general election.

It was undoubtedly the most popular plank in the platform on which Governor Smith was elected, and it is so framed that while it will disfranchise 90 per cent of the negroes of the State, the right of franchise of every white man is preserved.

### THE STATE OF SOUTH CAROLINA.



To the Commissioners of Elections for the County of Lexington:

Whereas Hon. J. M. Epting, who, at the General Election held in November, 1906, was chosen a member of the House of Representatives for the Election District of Lexington County, to serve for two years, has since said election departed this life, and whereas the Constitution of the State of South Carolina directs that in such a case a writ of Election shall be issued by the Speaker of the House of Representatives for the purpose of filling the vacancy thus occasioned for the remainder of the term for which the Member so dying was elected to serve:

Now, therefore, You and each of you are hereby required, after due advertisement, and with strict regard to all the provisions of the Constitution and Laws of the said State touching your duty in such case, to hold an election for a Member of the House of Representatives, for the Election District aforesaid, to serve for the remainder of the term for which the said J. M. Epting was elected; the Polls to be opened at the various places of election in the said District on Tuesday, the tenth day of September, 1907, by the various sets of Managers for those places respectively; and the counting of the votes cast and the declaration of the result of the election to be in accordance with the provisions of law providing for the General Elections and the manner of conducting the same.

This Writ, together with your return of the Election to be held under it, have before the House of Representatives at its next meeting after the election.

Witness the Honorable Richard S. Whaley, Esquire, Speaker of the House of Representatives, at Charleston, S. C., this tenth day of July, in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and seven.
