He gave chase but could not overtake them; nor could he distinguish whether they were white or black.

Republican Movements in the County. A meeting of the Republican County Executive Committee was called for last Saturday. The following members attended: Henry Kennedy, Chairman, Wm. Suber, from No. 2, Fred Brooks, from No. 5, Caddy Simmons, from No. 7, and F. L. Hicks, from No. 8. The question of making County nominations was discussed, the only difference of opinion being as to the method, some favoring nominations by the Executive Committee, others preferring a Convention. It was finally decided to call a County Convention next Saturday, the 28th instant, for the purpose of making nominations.

There is no doubt, though, that the chief interest centres on the Legislature. We understand there are several colored candidates for this nomination.

The County Treasury Deficiency. Mr. Winthrop Williams, Clerk in the Comptroller's office, came up Monday to investigate the defalcation in the Whites case and to ascertain, as far as possible, the amount involved, the object being to institute suit upon the official bond.

Deducting \$1,509.47 for probable nulla bona taxes and \$920 for polls not collected, Mr. Williams estimates the deficiency as follows:

County, 1,102 67

School, 1,924 46

Total, \$5,897 34

To this must be added the sum turned over to Mr. Whites as Treasurer in 1877, by order of Court, 3,226 76

Total deficiency, \$9,124 10
