State of South Carolina. Office of State Superintendent of Education. COLUMBIA, July 10, 1870.

1. The School Commissioner of each County, upon his receipt of a copy of this Circular, will please to proceed at once (if he has not already done so) to furnish Teachers under his supervision with the necessary Blank Forms, and to instruct said Teachers immediately to make out and file with him their claims for services rendered during or within the time extending from April 1st, 1870, to the last Friday in June, 1870.

2. Each School Commissioner is particularly requested to send to this Office no claims of Teachers for services rendered during or within the period of time aforementioned, until all such claims shall have been filed with him.

3. School Commissioners can obtain supplies of Printed Blank Forms for Teachers' Reports and Claims, by applying to this Office. Teachers need not apply to this Office for the said blanks.
