AMERICANS FIGHT IN SIGHT Of Famous Sedan—In Plain View of City's Buildings.

With the American Forces on the Sedan Front, Nov. 6.—American forces this afternoon were fighting within sight of Sedan, famous for the great battle fought in the Franco-German war in 1870.

From the hills in the region of Chemery and Maisoncelle, where the Americans, according to last accounts, were advancing despite stubborn resistance, the buildings of Sedan are in plain view, being about six miles away.

American troops continued their advance to-day between the Meuse and the Bar, moving forward at one place more than three miles.

On the west bank of the Meuse the Germans have been driven entirely from the Bois de Hespice, two miles north of Beaumont.

Along the heights of the Meuse in the region of Sassey and between Mihly and Dun the Americans made progress, despite heavy machine gun and artillery resistance on the part of the Germans.

Rear-Guard Actions The Germans continue their rear-guard actions on the rugged hills and wooded districts east of the Meuse, against which the Americans are advancing steadily.

The village of Beaumont, where there are more than 400 French civilians, is the particular target of the Germans. All last night they deluged Beaumont with poison gas.

Another formidable enemy defense line, on which the Germans planned to make a stand, was smashed by the Americans late Tuesday, when they captured the town of Le Tanne, in the bend of the Meuse south of Mouzon.

From LeTanne the line extends along the Meuse through Pouilly and Luor and eastward.

This line was part of the new defenses along the Meuse from Stenay northward to Sedan. An elaborate trench system recently had been completed, along with numerous wire entanglements, concrete dugouts and miles of concrete emplacements for heavy machine guns.

In some places the emplacements were only 15 yards apart.

Germans Felling Trees. In their retreat east of the Meuse the Germans, according to reports reaching American headquarters, are destroying property and cutting down trees along the roadways.

American aviators reported to-day that the highway from Stenay northward to Clizy-sur-Chiers is blocked every few yards by trees across the road.

The destruction begins just beyond Stenay and extends northeast and north from one to three miles.

As an indication of the plight of the retreating Germans it is known that on the entire western front the enemy has in reserve only one division, which has been out of the battle one month, and four divisions which have been resting from two to four weeks.

Two of the divisions are east of the Meuse.

The Germans, it is believed, have used all their reserves on the front opposite the Americans, the last enemy division in reserve on this sector having been thrown back in the desperate effort to stem the American advance.

THOMAS J. HOPKINS DEAD.

Passed Away at Home of Parents in Seneca Tuesday. (Farm and Factory, Nov. 7.) Thomas J. Hopkins, third son of Mr. and Mrs. J. N. Hopkins, died at the home of his parents in Seneca Tuesday afternoon at 1:05 o'clock.

He suffered from a complication of diseases resulting from a nervous breakdown.

T. J. served at the printer's trade, working last on the Greenville News. There is now a great scarcity of help, and Mr. Hopkins, in efforts to serve his employers, worked seven nights each week as a linotype operator—too much for any man—and his health became broken and bad.

He was forced to leave his machine, and came to Seneca in the hope of recuperating. His physical strength, however, was too near exhausted, and after having been confined to his room for only a few days, during which time he suffered greatly, he died. In newspaper parlance "thirty" has sounded for a clean and indefatigable worker, and the foreman in the big office has the proof of a life filled with service and profit to his fellowman.

Mr. Hopkins was born February 1, 1885, and was, therefore, 33 years, nine months and four days old. He died in the zenith of life. He never married. Besides his parents he is survived by three brothers, H. G. Hopkins, of Lulu, Ga.; H. J. Hopkins, of Greenville, and Fred Hopkins of the American Expeditionary Forces; and four sisters, Mrs. John Callatt, of Anderson; Misses Bessie, Alice and Martha. One brother, Joe, preceded him to the grave several years.

Mr. Hopkins, we believe, never connected himself with a church. His rule of life was to do unto others as he would be done by, and with his comrades his word was as good as his bond. He was a member of the International Typographical Union and the Woodmen of the World.

Funeral services were held Wednesday afternoon at 3 o'clock at the residence of Mr. and Mrs. Hopkins and interment followed in Mountain View cemetery, the floral tributes from friends and admirers being numerous and beautiful.
