

Letter from North Paeolet
THICKETTY, April 2, 1877.
EDITOR NORTH TIMES.—The earliest history we have of North Paeolet is given by Dr. Ramsey, in his history of South Carolina, where he says that Col. Clark, of Virginia, with a Colony, about the year 1755, settled on Paeolet River—the only settlement then made in that part of the State. This settlement was just below Eastwood's Shoals, on the North side of Paeolet. That from that date to 1775 the Country increased rapidly with settlers. There were great facilities for raising stock, from the profusion of native grasses and canes; most all the bottom lands being cane-brakes at that time, furnished an unending supply of food for stock all seasons. Buffaloes were so plentiful then that four or five hunters, with dogs, could kill from ten to twenty in one day; that Bears were so numerous, one huntsman in the Fall season could kill two or three thousand pounds of bear meat in one day; that there appeared to be no end to the Turkeys, Deer, Wild Cats, Panthers, Beavers, Otters, &c., and a supply of fish for all who might wish.

Gov. Hampton Declines a Formal Reception.—Washington, March 29.—Messrs. Northington and some half dozen other prominent Democrats of the district waited upon General Butler in order to make arrangements for a formal reception of Governor Hampton. General Butler received them very courteously, and upon learning the object of their visit, said he did not think such a thing would be advisable, as Governor Hampton desired to make his visit as quietly as possible. This evening the matter was mentioned to Governor Hampton, and he expressed his gratification that the matter had been declined by General Butler.
