possible. In the census the corn crop is put

below that this year. I doubt if it reaches half.
To furnish any permanent relief it should be
double. The plant is well cultivated and looks
promising.

AGRICULTURAL, & C.
South Carolina—Report on Her Agricultural Condition and Prospects.
Mr. Theo. C. Peters, of the United States
Agricultural Department, has made a report to
the Commissioner on the Agricultural condition
of the South. The following is the substance
of the report which treats of this State.
