

THE BLOODIEST RECORDS

Were Made by South Carolina and Pennsylvania Troops.

The bloody records of the civil war show some interesting parallels between the records of regiments on the opposing sides...

Pennsylvania championed the North in the contest for the first place on the roll of honor, and a trifle over 7 per cent of her quota of soldiers met death on the battlefield.

South Carolina furnished the regiment that lost the highest number killed in battle during the war—Orr's South Carolina Rifles...

The first place on the Union side was taken by the 11th New Hampshire, with a loss of 235 men in the second battle of Bull Run...

Here begins another duel between the Keystone and Palmetto. The 33d rolled up a score of 971 killed and wounded, the deaths scoring 231.

The 83d Pennsylvania came into being as a reorganization of a regiment composed of volunteer and militia companies that responded to President Lincoln's first call...

The colonel at the head of both regiments, John W. McLane, had served as a volunteer officer in the Mexican war, and distinguished himself as a master in organization and drill.

This Provisional regiment and the one formed out of it were created and led by the same colonel, Maxey Gregg, who had been a volunteer officer in the Mexican war...

Each went to its respective station for assignment to place in line, and both began their fighting careers on the same day and on the same field...

No fanciful comparison could be drawn between the two regiments. The regiments started fairly equal, and both were in the thickest of the fight...

The color guard went down to a man, and the colonel, D. H. Hamilton, took the flag and called on his men to stand Gregg, seeing the slaughter and the uselessness of trying to advance...

The Carolina brigade marched to the field of Gettysburg in July with well-filled ranks. Gen. A. P. Hill was their corps leader in place of the dead "Stonewall"...

The 1st lost twelve killed and eighty-eight wounded, one hundred in all, with seven officers among the fallen.

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One day later, almost to an hour, at the other flank of the same field, the 83d Pennsylvania fought gallantly to defend Round Top...

At second Bull Run the Carolina brigade was ordered to defend the famous railroad cut, which was Stonewall Jackson's key in that desperate contest.

At Spottsylvania a week later, the 1st, reduced to a handful, entered the "Bloody Angle" with its brigade, in the forlorn attempt to hold its assailants at arm's length...

In the Maryland campaign following second Bull Run the South Carolinians shared in the bloodiest victory at Harpers Ferry, and later on the bloody Hill of September...

At Fredericksburg, in December following, it again found a warm corner by one of those accidents of battle that do not lessen the sting of bullets even if they win no victories...

The affair ended abruptly, and neither regiment was severely engaged, but the colonel of the 1st, Col. C. W. McCrady, was shot dead by a stray bullet...

On March 31, also, the 83d scored 231 deaths, and on April 1 added one, making 232, closing its record of wounded at the same time.

Gregg was killed in the gap trying to right things, and another colonel of the brigade, Samuel McGowan, took command, giving his name to the organization.

By the time "Stonewall" Jackson, who was its corps leader while he lived, was once more on the warpath to double up the Union army...

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Lieutenant, W. M. Murray and J. F. J. Caldwell and ninety-four men wounded—one hundred and twenty in all, which was more than half its membership.

In the Wilderness battle, on May 5, 1862, the first led its brigade and division in an attack on the Union left on the Orange plank road...
