The Great Western Railway in Canada has been arranged, by the addition of a third track, so that the narrow gauge cars of the New York and Chicago can go through direct from New York to Chicago with but a single change of cars. Arrangements have been made by the Secretary of the Treasury to modify the customs regulations with Canada, and in future there will be no detention at the boundary line for the purpose of examining personal baggage.

The receipts at San Francisco from internal revenue during the month of December were \$48,000. About 480,000 gallons of spirits were distilled within the limits of San Francisco last year. The total value of sugar refined in San Francisco last year is \$6,517,000. Twenty-five hundred pounds of fleece wool were sold on Saturday at 13c.
