The Prospect Brightens.

In settling the affairs of the South Congress vacillates. To our eyes, the incompetency of a distant, irresponsible and inimical authority, to manage this difficult business, has been manifest from the very first. With the Washington politicians, reconstruction contemplated nothing less, and nothing more, than the organization of a certain party, acting in concert with their plans and contributing to the permanence of their power. The South was a check-board upon which they have been deftly moving the black and white chessmen to and fro. We are glad to observe, from recent developments, that this pleasant game of legislation approaches its end. The interests of the South are the interests of the whole country. This circumstance imposes a restraint upon political extravagance. Besides this, the government cannot settle into a rigid sectionalism without losing its republican character. Laws made for the States on this side of the Potomac must either be repealed, or else be extended to the States beyond that historic boundary. Infractions of right and liberty must be nationalized or repudiated. Before these two powerful lines of defence—the inner and the outer—the Radicals are losing heart. Already that perfect discipline relaxes, to which they have owed so much of their success.

One of the most striking evidences of party demoralization is afforded by the Congressional contest over what has been called the Fifteenth Constitutional amendment.

In the form in which it first passed the House, it was a purely political measure. It extended to every class and every color the right of suffrage—a measure not without perils, yet necessary to the integrity of the party. To impose educational qualifications would not do; for many of the educated among the newly enfranchised will not vote with the Radicals. But in the Senate, Mr. Wilson, who bursts into "a light blaze of patriotism" on all such occasions, and who wished to administer a rebuke to the malcontent Legislature of Georgia, amended the House bill. Under his inspiration, it was resolved that everybody should have the right of holding office also, without any intellectual or educational qualifications whatever! Blinded with sectional prejudice, and incited by an eager desire to chastise the South, the Senate passed the amendment in such a form as, had it prevailed, would have overthrown the civil government of the whole country. It is curious, and even amusing, to observe the recoil which the action of the Senate produced at the North. There was a general outcry at the recklessness of the measure. Grant was astounded—of course. But who would have expected that Wendell Phillips would appear among the opponents and denounce, as in last week's Anti-Slavery Standard he has done, the "Radicalism of the Senate." The result appears in the form in which the proposed constitutional amendment now appears. In the contest inaugurated by Georgia the Senate of the United States has experienced a defeat.

Indeed, the clouds are drifting away in every direction. It is now authoritatively stated that Grant's influence is persistently directed to the rehabilitation of the Southern States—that he desires and intends to be the ruler of a united country. And with the strong Congressional influence he wields, there is every prospect that his purpose will be realized. It will be to his advantage and ours when a single race ceases to be the chief subject of national legislation, and when public measures are no longer, on a sliding scale, adjusted to different parallels of latitude.

We take the more pleasure in referring to this subject now, because some of our readers have esteemed us to have been too sanguine. The course of events is a justification of our cheerful predictions. We have never expected to escape difficulties and privations; nor do we now anticipate a cloudless future. But "we have set our house in order, to live and not to die." And already the winter that has lasted so long has a softer tone, and its rigors relax with the breath of spring.

A French View of the Future of Mexico.

The Courier des Etats Unis calls attention to the state of anarchy which now prevails in Mexico, and the probability of the ultimate absorption of the country by the United States. It takes occasion to point out what it conceives to have been the fatal blunder of the French people, in clamorously demanding the withdrawal of the troops sent to place Maximilian on the throne, and thus bringing about his downfall and death. Napoleon III, it says, was obliged to yield to the will of the nation, and therefore they, and not he, are responsible for the consequences. France had to ward Mexico a chivalrous, a disinterested affection. It desired to raise her from her chronic state of weakness, and give to her a government which should assure to her order and happiness. But the cry was raised, "Rather let a nation perish as a republic than flourish as a monarchy," and the enthusiasm was chilled. The United States, perfidiously desiring to hasten a catastrophe which would yield it a magnificent addition to its territory, encouraged the reaction in popular feeling, repeating in a thousand ways that a despotic arrangement would let them alone, which they don't. These little rascals take great delight in upsetting their cigar stands and offering their dead rats and cats, picked out of the gutters, and suddenly jerking their queues from behind; and as nobody can catch one of these rascals, the poor Celestials have to grin and bear it. A small school for instructing them in English was opened about two months ago, and the pupils attending it (numbering about forty, and only one woman among them) are making great progress in spelling and reading. They are very close and eager in their studies, and so apt that they learn the alphabet in one evening, and can spell short words the second or third day. As the proposed Fifteenth amendment contemplates them as voters, it is a good thing to prepare them for official honors.
