TO THE BICE FACTORS OF CHARLESTON.

CHARLESTON, March 17. 369.

The undersigned purchasers of rice respectfully suggest, that after the lat May next the charge for iteroes be discontinued, and an additional price be put upon the grain to cever the costs of the package. In presenting this matter, we call y ur attention to the few forms of the charge which we trust will be sufficient to effect the charge which we and our correspondents carnestly desire:

1. Rice, we believe, is the only product of this country, sold in our market, on which there is a separate charge for package.

2. The actual cost of hogsheads and barrels is much greater than the excibitant price of rice ti-roes, and yet the furchaser of sugar, bacon molasses and whickey is never charged by the factor, packer or destiller, with the cost of packa.

3. The sellers of rice in New York, Philadelphia, Boston, Baltimore, New Orleans, St. Louis Chicago, and all other large business centres, do not elarge for tierces, and have repeatedly complained of the said charge in this market

4. It is for the interest of the planter, the factor, and the purchaser, that the Western demand for Carolina rice be diverted from forthern cities and brought to the planters markets, Charleston and Savannah.

Our ratiroad and steamship companies offer liberal facilities for the transportation of rice to every part of the country; and we sak that the factors of Charleston, who have always been alive to the interests of the city, will remove an obstacle in the way of a more extended trade.
