There is no trouble in giving our steamships full and prompt freight, if our merchants will only remember that a simple appreciation of the advantages of direct trade will not enable owners to pay running expenses and the interest on capital.

These things certainly deserve immediate and careful attention; and we hope that both the Chamber of Commerce and Board of Trade will at once take measures to give all the assistance in their power to the direct steamship line, and will concert arrangements for a live and hearty co-operation with the owners and agents.

Direct Trade. Last season a line of safe and commodious steamships plied regularly between Charleston and Liverpool.

We believe that we are justified in saying that, if our merchants and brokers take any active interest in the important matter of direct trade with Europe, a Charleston and Liverpool steamship line will be in regular operation through the coming business season.

The chief points to which attention should be given, in connection with this question of direct trade, are—1. The propriety of capitalists in this city being part owners of the line.

A subscription of a few thousand dollars by merchants in South Carolina would prove our faith in the direct line, and show that we are in earnest.

2. Immigrants will form the best kind of inward freight for our steamships. They can be brought here as cheaply as they can be taken to New York, while the passage will be attended with less risk and discomfort.

3. The perfection of arrangements for filling and dispatching the ships without an hour of unnecessary delay.
