NEWS OF THE DAY.

In New York yesterday cotton was firmer, closing quiet at 28 cents for middlings. Gold was quiet and steady at the close at 28 1/2.

Saturday, September 26th, the water was five feet seven inches below the top of the dam, and was falling at the rate of seven inches every twenty-four hours, and that, consequently, the flow of water in the aqueduct was reduced to less than 18,000,000 gallons a day.

That Terrible Taxation.

The State taxes now collecting, for the year 1868, amount in the aggregate to about \$1,200,000, and the State taxes for the year 1869 are due and must be paid on or before March 1st, next.
