A Trades Union in Court.

An important suit as to the legal rights of combinations of workmen, which has just been tried in England before Justice Hannan, at Leeds, is reported by the Baltimore Sun.

Thereupon began a suit for damages, and after hearing the evidence and arguments, Justice Hannan charged the jury, saying: "If the injury was effected by untrue representations, it was obvious there was a wrong for which the defendants were answerable."
