### Speaker Colfax.

WASHINGTON, November 22.—The speech of Speaker Colfax here, requiring new tests from the South, does not meet with President Johnson's approval. The latter remains firm to his own policy. Most of the pardon business is suspended for the present at the Attorney-General's office by order of the President.

### From Mexico.

NEW YORK, November 20.—News received here states that Maximilian has ordered all his forces withdrawn from outposts, and concentrated at three points: Vera Cruz, City of Mexico, and San Luis Potosi. The Liberals are much comforted at the report that National aid will soon reach them.

### The Florida Convention.

WASHINGTON, November 20.—The President has been advised by telegraph that the Florida Convention has annulled the Ordinance of Secession, abolished slavery, declared no person incompetent to testify as a witness on account of color in any matter where a colored person is concerned, repudiated the Confederate States debt, amended the Constitution in other respects, and adjourned.

### Burning of Ship Harry of the West.

MOBILE, November 21.—The steamship Mercedita arrived here yesterday, and brings Capt. Atwood and part of the crew of the ship Harry of the West, bound from New Orleans to Liverpool, which vessel was burned at sea on the 12th inst., about one hundred miles from the South-west Pass, having on board a cargo of three thousand three hundred and forty-three bales of cotton. The cause of the fire was unknown. The balance of the crew was taken off by the British ship Ella.
