FEMALE STUDENTS AT CLINICS—DISGRACEFUL BEHAVIOR OF MALE STUDENTS.—Last week, twenty-seven young ladies attended clinical lectures at the Pennsylvania Hospital in Philadelphia, for the first time in the history of the institution. After the lecture, some 200 or 300 male students, by a concerted plan, and in spite of the efforts of the managers of the hospital to preserve order, ranged themselves so as to occupy both sides of the whole of the foot-walk inside of the hospital enclosure, which compelled the twenty-seven lady students to take the roadway, and thus pass between the double lines of the male students, while the latter saluted them with taunts and jeers, mock applause and real hisses.
