from Mittag to Gill. If this is not a strange proceeding in legal matters, we are at a loss to comprehend. The Land Commission paid Gill \$8 per acre—\$8,032 for the 1,004 acres—a clear gain to Gill, Donaldson and Mittag, of \$6,000. The land is known to be utterly worthless and there is not a be utterly worthless, and there is not a colored or white man in this County who would accept it as a free gift from the State and be compelled to depend upon it for a support. We understand the colored people are preparing a protest against the purchase, which will be presented to the Advisory Board. We think, if the colored people will sift this and other matters thoroughly, in which these men have been engaged for the last two years, they will arrive at a just appreciation of their services to the interest of the colored race.

The above facts are without exaggeration, and received the assent of a pro-minent colored radical, before they were put in type.—Lancaster Ledger.
