

The Duke of Edinburgh's baby has already begun to taste some of the sweets of royalty, having received a great number of nice presents from his royal relations, including a cradle in silver filigree, lined with pink silk, pink curtains, covered with white lace, held up by an elegantly chiselled pole, with a charming baby face looking out from a knot of pink ribbons. Princess Beatrice has worked a quilt of white satin for this beautiful cradle, and embroidered the same with roses, so natural as almost to deceive the eye. A silver gilt service, consisting of saucers, plate, mug, spoon and fork of the same, engraved with the arms of England and the initials of the royal baby, are also among the presents.

The murderers of Chris. Harris, near Bethany, Butler County, Ohio, Sunday night, have confessed. They are Wm. and Jane Harris, his father and mother, and Jasper, Samuel and James Harris, his three brothers. The family are low, stupid, ignorant, savage people. Fighting among them has been common. They say Christopher committed an indecent offence Sunday night, and Jasper and his other brothers took him out to the wood-pile and killed him for it. The parties concerned, five in number, are arrested, and the young girls of the family are under guard.

The South Carolina Railroad has made a proposition to lease the Charlotte, Columbia and Augusta Railroad for a term of years. A committee was appointed to consider the matter, and to report at a future meeting. It is stated that the Southern stockholders of the company favor the lease and the opposition to it comes from Southern Security Company.

HAD NO MONEY.—A decent-looking young man, on being approached, recently, by the captain of a St. Louis ferry boat on which he was traveling, for his five cents' fare, replied, "I have no money," jumped overboard, and was drowned.

Wm. F. Barry, aged ninety-six, supposed to be the oldest printer in the United States, was buried in St. Louis on the 25th. His first take as a journeyman was Washington's obituary. At ninety years of age he worked at the case in Nashville, Tenn.
