Marion County School Teachers

About thirty county teachers met in regular session at the armory, Saturday. A dozen of their friends complimented them on their presence. President Carn presided and Miss Sarah Bull recorded the session.

Of course there was great disappointment because Dr. Forbes, president of the John B. Stetson University, was unable to be present, because of a serious attack of the grip, brought on by overwork.

President Carn said that if any one wanted literature of the university and its work in the normal course, it was there for distribution, and he would be pleased to have the name and address of any one who desired to attend the normal course.

Miss Edith J. Meadows was the first on the program, but she had written the president that she could not be at the meeting.

Miss Sarah Bull of the Ocala High School was next called on, but apologized because she had not time to prepare a paper, but read Professor Hughes', of the Toronto, Canada, school, estimate of Charles Dickens, the greatest delineator of human character that ever wielded a pen, and his insight into the true characteristics of childhood. It will be remembered that Professor Hughes delivered this address before the state teachers' association at St. Augustine, and what a grand treat it was to them. Dickens was the first Englishman to recognize the theories and appreciate them of the great American educators, Barney and Horace, Mann. He also insisted for government control of schools. In Dickens' description of the bad and good schools and teachers, the never-to-be-forgotten characters of Dr. Blummer and Miss Teakel, Dr. Strong and Squeers were truly depicted.

Mrs. M. A. Ross of Martel, one of the oldest teachers in the county, read a well prepared paper. As we interpreted it, for we could not hear distinctly, it was on the "Functions of the Teacher." She seemed to think the good old days, when the "lord of the birch" bounded around and his word was law, when children had to go to school were better than now, when the option rested with the pupil, so far as habitation went, for the season. She gave the present system of examinations a thrust, for they made the teacher, when often the basic principles that make the true teacher were lacking, though she admitted that the best qualified persons, educationally and theoretically speaking, were teachers. Proper preparation, with love of the work,


