London, April 10.-A telegram from Aliwal North says:

General Brabant's colonial troops fought all day yesterday and resumed this morning. Several Boer commandoes are hurrying to the scene. The colonials silenced the Boer cannon yesterday. The Boers are trying to swing around and cut the railway between Bloemfontein and Cape Town. If they succeed, Roberts' army will be in a tight place.


