That the conclusion has and will be made from your editorial that the sanitary condition of the city is responsible for the health of the town, and has made it "the worst in several years," your attention is called to the issue of the Metropolis of the 6th inst., and to the article under the head of "The Penalty of Neglect."

It may be that the sanitary condition of the town produces so much sickness. If so, then some such cause produced sickness throughout the county—"the worst in several years"—and the same conditions exist not only in Ocala and Marion county, but, from newspaper reports, in the other towns and counties in the state. That terrible epidemic of la grippe that has produced, in my opinion, a large per cent. of the sickness in the city, is, in no manner, traceable to sanitary conditions.

The article in the Metropolis is calculated to do us great damage, yet it seems to be fully justified in its statement from your article.

You will understand that no one finds objection to your reference to those matters pertaining to the welfare of the city, but thank you for your interest, and ask for a vigilant continuance, but, at the same time, if you have innocently published erroneous facts, doing the public a wrong, you will gladly correct it when your attention is called to it.
