Long sympathized with Payne, as he is a candidate, but Irvine's motion was that "each man show his hand."

Then it was that Payne withdrew.

Strauss wanted to know about the voting power when half the delegation was absent.

Afterward a resolution passed, giving each precinct a full vote, no matter if part of the delegation was absent.

L. S. Light of Reddick, who returned to the good old democratic fold from populism, was greeted with tremendous applause when McIver said he was glad to welcome him into the straight and narrow path of purified politics.

With a little more parliamentary skirmishing a vote was taken on Irvine's amendment, which was adopted by 32 to 11, namely: nominations from the floor and a ballot by roll call.

On motion of Long the number of delegates was made eighteen, with half a vote each; but before this was carried Carney interposed with a suggestion, which was to the effect that money in the hands of the county executive committee be used to pay the fare of the county delegates to the conventions. He said that town people rode on passes and country people had to pay their fare, hence their slim attendance.

Chairman Bullock explained: There are \$56 in the hands of the secretary of the county executive committee, but on whose authority is he to pay out this money. Mr. Long contended that the executive committee controlled this fund, hence it could not be divided as Carney suggested. Benjamin raised the point of order that Carney was not in order, and the chair sustained it, but not until Morgan offered an amendment to make the delegation only nine, and that he was opposed to taxing anybody for paying another person's fare to any convention. No second.

A vote on the number of delegates was then taken, making it 18. Only two dissenting votes.

Adjourned until 2 p. m. for dinner.

AFTERNOON

On motion of McLeod the chair appointed a committee of five to prepare resolutions. The names were McLeod, Wartmann, Will Hocker, Irvine and Strozier.

Nominations were then in order.

The following persons declined: Strozier, W. J. Chambers, W. S. Bullock and Alfred Ayer.

Nominations were then closed and thirty minutes were given for consultation.
