OCALA IS STRICTLY IN IT

Results of a Ride on the Plant System to Clearwater and Return

While it is true we were only absent two days the time was consumed in taking in Tarpon Springs and Clearwater, with incidental post offices, saw mills, stores and citizens encountered on the overland between these two places, and were assured that 80 per cent. of the section referred to will vote for Ocala. The reader will please remember, too, we formed our estimate by personal contact with the voter and putting the question straight and not judging from the number of people addressed at a public meeting.

At Lacochee we struck a saw mill with six votes. Every man was outspoken for Ocala, including the railroad agent, postmaster and store keeper.

Tribby was undecided; didn't care much about the state capital; rather thought it was cheaper to leave it where it was; but Monroe Brown's speech at Dade City set the gray matter to work in several minds who were present from Tribby and aroused them from indifference to thought and they became strong advocates for Ocala.

Tarpon Springs was about unanimous for Ocala. Did not hold a public meeting, but put in three solid hours making a personal canvass and giving out Ocala's wheel of fortune and the little leaflet that recounts Ocala's proposition and what she will do for the state capitol. It is a sure winner every time. We distributed 100 leaflets and came in personal contact with fully seventy-five people and only one of them said he was opposed to removal and that on account of expense, but favored Ocala if it had to be moved.

When we put the question thus: "If you don't locate it east of the Suwannee river, the expense is sure to come and it will hit you without a premium to your credit in the way of a donation of \$125,000 from Ocala." It had not occurred to him before in that light and he said he would debate it in his own mind on that basis.

In the overland trip Dunedin was the only place they preferred leaving it at Tallahassee because of taxation, but couldn't answer the question of expense if it remained there, and fifty or a hundred thousand dollars was expended on the building.

Clearwater was almost a unit for Ocala and gave this subject a splendid audience and hearing, estimated at several hundred, Saturday night.

Good judges estimate Ocala's vote at 80 per cent. and say if the Tallahasseeans could be made to see the taxation coming if it remained there, the vote would be almost a unit for Ocala.

The country voter, the true bucolic, is the one that gets the shivers when you talk about a new capitol building. That question settled, Ocala would win out in the capitol race in fine style.

This is the result of our campaigning, in a few words, and a statement shorn of all padding and personal contention.

At Tarpon Springs such men as Editor Converse, Merchants Noblet, Gleason, Sponger, W. W. K. Decker and others whose names I can not recall said: "Tarpon is solid for Ocala. They don't need a public meeting, but will get up one if you wish. Just keep on as you have begun, a personal canvass, and you'll soon find it as represented." We did.

Tarpon Notes

Tarpon is one of the most attractive villages in the state. It has many lovely homes, some really fine ones owned and occupied by winter residents. Its location is ideal and the mirror-like sheet of water at the head of Main street is a thing of beauty and a joy forever to its people and their winter companions. It supports an excellent local paper, the Herald, whose proprietors and publishers are Messrs. J. C. Converse & Son, pleasant people to meet.

The chief industry of the town is its sponge product, which amounts to fully \$200,000 annually, of which W. W. K. Decker does more than a fourth. A number of fine groves are in bearing.

The regret of its people is the loss of their very attractive and popular winter hotel a year ago by fire. As it is, "The Fern," so named from its wealth of ferns and vines, a veritable bower of floral beauty, and "The Oaks," admirably conducted by Mrs. W. J. Phillips, who is enlarging the same because of the promise of winter custom, are up to date hostleries.

A KILLING AT SHADY GROVE

Arthur Gallipeau, White, Shot John Bell, Colored

According to the Evidence So Far, Gallipeau Had Very Little Reason

Sunday morning, at 7 o'clock, Arthur Gallipeau, a white man, who has a little wagon works and blacksmith shop at Shady Grove, about eight miles southwest of Ocala, rode up to the home of John Bell, a colored farmer, and called him out. Bell came to the door and said, "Mr. Gallipeau, I got your message, that you were going to make it hot for me when you saw me again." Gallipeau cursed Bell and told him if he did not pay him that \$1.50 he owed him, he would make it very hot. Bell replied that he had let Gallipeau have 1000 bricks, which overpaid him and left Gallipeau owing him, Bell, 90 cents. Gallipeau said it was not so and wanted the money. Bell offered to leave it to two men to arbitrate and bide the decision. Gallipeau was willing, but wanted it done at once. Bell said he would not settle it on Sunday, but would on Monday. Gallipeau cursed him again and drew his 44-caliber revolver and fired. The ball struck on the shoulder blade and glanced off. Bell turned and started for the house and Gallipeau fired again. This time the ball struck Bell in the back of the neck, breaking the bone and killing him instantly. Gallipeau rode off and later came into town and gave himself up to Sheriff Nugent. The above facts are substantially the evidence of two eye witnesses, colored men, Ben Beckwith and Peter Bell. Coroner T. D. Crawford went out and empaneled a jury, who returned a verdict in accordance with the above. Mr. Gallipeau was given a preliminary hearing before Dr. Crawford at 11 o'clock this morning.

After hearing the evidence Dr. Crawford committed the prisoner to custody without bail. Edwin Spencer represented the state and W. K. Zewadski defended the prisoner.


