The famous Sam Jacobs murder trial is on today, in Judge Hocker's court. Jacobs is supposed to have killed another negro, Charley McCracklin, at Shady Grove, last July a year ago. At the last term of the court he was tried and the jury made a mistrial. He was remanded to jail and together with seven other prisoners broke jail and escaped, and despite the reward of \$200 offered by Sheriff Nugent and the strenuous efforts made to capture him, remained at large until after court convened this time, when he came in and voluntarily gave himself up to Mr. Nu-

The trial will likely consume two days. R. B. Bullock is defending the man. There is a long list of witnesses for both sides.
