ZEWADSKI FOR SPEAKER

Zewadski, of Ocala, Marion county, whose selection would be a just recognition of the gentleman's well earned reputation as a thorough going man of business and high legal attainments and whose record as a conservative yet untiring worker and useful member of the legislature has won enviable distinction for himself and honor for the county whose constituents he so faithfully served.

Mr. Zewadski stands high among his legislative co-laborers and I feel confident that if he will enter the race for speaker there are few men in the state who will develop greater strength or stand a better chance to be elected, which his host of friends in Marion and other counties of the state can greatly aid. Let us insist that Mr. Zewadski make the race and that we pledge him our united support.
