

CURING MEAT

The Star learns with pleasure from Mr. Simon Benjamin, the wide awake and up to date manager of the East Florida Ice Company, that the farmers of this and adjacent counties are learning the "saving grace" there is in Mr. Benjamin's refrigerator rooms to cure meat and give them an article that will pass through the summer in excellent condition and in flavor far superior to imported meats. During the week over 2000 pounds of fresh pork were received and the refrigerator now holds some 12,000 pounds, which will be largely increased as the season advances.

There were received from the Oxford section hams that weighed 39 pounds.

County Commissioner E. C. McLeod is one of the heavy patrons of the refrigerator. He has now in cold storage over 2400 pounds, which is only one-fourth of what he expects to cure during the winter.

Last season he experimented with 3000 pounds and was so well pleased with the result he will triple the quantity this season.

Every farmer who has pork that he wishes to "cure for keeps" should put himself in communication with Manager Benjamin, of the Ice Factory, and he will never regret it.

The cold storage room is a place worth visiting and every farmer in this and neighboring counties should patronize it for the money there is in it to them.

THE FAIRFIELD TRAGEDY

Jesse Jones on Trial for Killing Joe Nettles

The Jones case was called at 11 a. m., but it was nearly twelve before the prisoner got through consulting with his attorney.

Following witnesses were then called for the state: L. E. and Mrs. Mock, L. Y. Edwards, J. C. Smith, H. D. Dansby, F. E. Smoak, A. L. Prisco and Dr. P. Bergen.

Defendant's witnesses were J. Y. Jones, J. A. Jones, Jr., M. L. Moon, R. Williamson, Ross Dorcer, Perry Brown, M. E. Phillips, T. B. Floyd, Jno. Smith and Mrs. Jno. Smith.

The court had a certificate from Dr. Bergen that Mrs. Smith was ill and could not be present. Attorney for defense insisted that Mrs. Smith was the most important witness on the case and they could not go to trial without her. Her evidence could not be supplied by any other. Besides the doctors' certificate did not state the cause of her illness or when she could be present. Could not and would not go to trial without her.

Dr. Bergen was then called and said her trouble was chronic and she could not make the trip.

R. A. Burford, attorney for prosecution, was opposed to postponement of the case, as the man was not on trial for his life, besides attorney for defense had not indicated what he proposed to prove by her. Attorney for Jones said her evidence would prove that Nettles a few days prior to the homicide had stated in her presence that he would kill Jones on sight.

It was then ordered that the attorney should prepare an affidavit according to law, have it sworn to and then the court would say what was to be done. Court then adjourned until 2 o'clock to permit of the affidavit to be prepared.
