CITY COUNCIL PROCEEDINGS

The city council convened Tuesday night in regular session. Following members present: Carmichael, Heivenston, Delouest, Scott, Hocker, Edwards and McConathy.

A communication was read from Hon. H. W. Long, chairman board of county commissioners, asking the council to pay one-half of the expense that will be incurred in renting rooms for the accommodation of the officers of the United States district court, a sitting of which will be held in Ocala the third day of January, continuing for about two weeks. The committee has rented four rooms in the Marion block, to be used by the district attorney, marshal, clerk of the court, and grand jury, at a cost of \$24, and an office for the judge in the Ocala House at \$1 per day, and have rented furniture to supply the rooms for \$18. The council agreed to share the expense with the county.

N. M. Allred presented an order on the council for the amount of the judgment rendered against the city in favor of B. H. Seymour, in Justice Crawford's court, for \$73.60, principal and costs for mule hire. This bill was originally \$60 and the council offered Mr. Seymour \$50 for the debt, but he declined, through Mr. Allred, and sued with the above results. The matter was referred to the finance committee, with instructions for the clerk to pay the claim if approved.

D. S. Woodrowe asked for a rebate of taxes on a double assessment of William Yongue, for whom he is agent. Referred to finance committee with instructions for it to be refunded if found as stated.

A communication was read from Mayor Bullock regarding the claim held by the First National Bank of Fernandina against the city, principal \$5730.41, bearing date of April, 1896, with interest at 8 per cent. The bank's attorney, Mr. Baker, demanded that at least the interest be paid. The clerk was instructed to calculate the interest to date and send the bank the treasurer's check for \$1000 on account of interest; \$1000 was paid on the interest last April. There remains after this payment, as it was remitted yesterday, only \$149.48 interest due to date. The bill of the clerk and inspectors of the late city election, \$22.50, was ordered paid.

J. J. Haley, of Bradentown, wrote the council wishing to buy 300 feet of second hand hose. Referred to the fire committee with power to act.

F. M. White, who is in Palatka working up a street fair and free shows, desired by letter to put in a street fair and half a dozen choice Bostick Shows in Ocala, as he makes a specialty of this business and has several nice street fairs and shows in stock. The letter was filed. Council adjourned.

FOR CHRISTMAS TRAVEL

The Seaboard Air Line Railway has put on the following rates for the Christmas holidays: To all points in Florida a rate of one fare for the round trip will be given; and to all points outside the state a rate of one and one-third fares for the round trip. This latter rate embraces all points east of the Mississippi and south of the Ohio and Potomac rivers.

The tickets go on sale December 22, 23, 24, 25, 30 and January 1st, and are limited until January 4th, 1901.

For students, on presentation of certificates from the principals, superintendents or presidents of schools or colleges, the same rates will apply, with the difference that the tickets will be sold December 15 to 21, with a final limit to January 8th, 1901.

RAILROAD REGULATIONS

Southeastern Car Association Storage Rules on Package Freight In Effect January, 1901

All freight received for delivery is subject to storage regulations. When stored in railroad company's local ware house storage charges will be as follows:

All packages of freight not removed by owners from the custody of the railroad within forty-eight hours, not including Sundays or legal holidays, computed from 10 o'clock a. m. of the day following the date of legal notice of arrival, shall thereafter be subject to a charge for storage each day or fraction of a day that such consignments may remain in custody of the railroad company, one cent per one hundred pounds per day, with minimum charge of 5 cents for any one package or lot for one consignee, but not more than \$1 per day for any consignee not in excess of a carload. Notice will be given to consignees to show when demurrage charges begin. Ocala, Fla., Dec. 17.
