## SOME RECENT HISTORY

Discovery of Phosphate in Marion County—A Story That Will Never Grow Old

Our visit to Dunnellon brought vividly to mind the era of phosphate discovery and the excitement and incidents attending same and how that important fact did more than any one thing in the history of the county to make it flourish financially and commercially.

And while this prominent fact is only a little more than twelve years old, a short resume of that important epoch will, we are confident, prove interesting reading to a large number of the Star's subscribers, and that we may not be in sight of the things that make us of importance in the eyes of the commercial world we append the leading incidents leading up to the discovery of phosphate in Marion county.

Albertus Vogt, of Dunnellon, made the discovery. No one questions the probability of giving him this distinction and honor. To use his own words: Along in March, 1889, he noticed around a spring in front of his house fossil remains of prehistoric animals, identical with those he had seen in the phosphate beds around Charleston, S. C. In April of 1889 a very dry season had set in and needing water for irrigating purposes around his place he secured a well boring machine and set a negro, Tom Stark, assisted by another negro, Abram Kitchen, to sinking for an artesian well.

Owing to Stark's carelessness, the auger got unshipped and was left in the ground at such a depth that the project was abandoned.

On the first of May the annual fish fry of that section was given at Renfro's Springs, to which all the neighbors gathered, and to punish Tom Stark for his carelessness in losing the auger, he set him to cleaning out the spring and doing some draining around it.

At noon, when Tom reported for dinner, he said, "Mr. Vogt, the devil is dead sure."

When asked for an explanation, he replied that he had dug up his teeth and bones, a portion of which was an elephant's tusk twelve inches around, a lot of molar teeth and thin bones of immense size.

Mr. Vogt repaired to the springs and on inspection felt satisfied there were nothing else than a phosphate deposit.

The usual pleasures of the picnic pulled on him and he set to work to fill a nail keg with specimens, which he brought to Ocala to have Miss Jessie Maugh, who was then the expert agent of Ocala, send the keg and its contents to Edmund Day, at Seymour, Conn., who is president of the American Rubber Trust and with whom Mr. Vogt had business relations at the time, loaning money for him on orange groves in Marion county. The thought of sending these phosphate samples to Mr. Day was the prompting of Mrs. Vogt, and now her husband wishes he had accepted her wishes, for had he done so he is satisfied it would be today several times a millionaire.

But arriving at Ocala Mr. Vogt thought he would call around and interview Mr. E. W. Agnew, the then merchant prince and banker of the town and county, and consult him. When the subject was broached Mr. Agnew did not seem to be impressed with the possibilities of phosphate in Marion county, though Mr. Alexander McInture, then cashier of the First National Bank, by intuition was so struck with the discovery that he induced Mr. Agnew to investigate it, and Mr. Agnew, and Mr. Vogt, on his way to the express office, dropped into the old Bank of Ocala located in the north end of the Ocala House block and there met Mr. Wood's friend, the lamented John P. Dunn, Ocala's standby, and casually mentioned the phosphate and to him.

Mr. Dunn at once desired to see the samples, and Walter Lancaster, then a clerk in the bank, was dispatched for them, and Dr. Bone Snowden, the only chemist then in Ocala, tested them with acid and said they were of the highest quality.

Mr. Dunn's mind was quickly made up. He explained to Mr. Vogt and accepted his hospitality, and ere the next morning was proprietor of had become the owner of an undivided half of ten acres, on which the spring was located, and here the phosphate beds were discovered, for which he paid \$10,000.

Mr. Vogt immediately went to work with Mr. Dunn's cooperation, and he obtained 2000 acres of land in Marion county. Then the same month, Samuel W. and I took A. C. into the deal, out of whose brains developed the Dunnellon Phosphate Company, which was then capitalized at \$1,200,000. Mr. Vogt realized out of the same \$2,000,000. While Mr. Vogt admits he has not paid this neat sum of money he has no regrets to express, for he really believes he has a big thing in his keeping now in his coat.

12:30 p. m.—At noon the President's condition continues to improve. Pulse, 104; temperature, 99; respiration, 25. Dr. McBurney leaves today. If there are no complications the physicians are confident of recovery, though all danger is not passed.


