## ELECTION OF TRUSTEES

School trustees will be chosen for the Ocala district twenty days from date. It is a very important office—too important to let pass without a word of warning to the patrons of our public schools. The present trustees are Col. R. A. Burford, Hon. J. M. Barco and the editor of the Star. They have tried to do their duty as they saw it and whatever was done has been single to the welfare of the public school education of the children. They did not do all they desired to do for the betterment of the schools and the advancement of the pupils, but all that the means at hand permitted them to do.

In this connection the writer is permitted to say that all the old trustees have been approached and asked to serve another term. None of them are seeking the office. They believe there are other men in the community equally as deeply interested in the upbuilding of the public school work and prefer, if it is the wish of those most interested in school work, that others take their place.

But the writer can say there is no man in the community who has shown a deeper interest in the welfare and progress of our schools than Col. Burford, whose services as chairman of the board of trustees have been of incalculable worth to our school interests, and in looking over our citizenship we can think of no one who in that capacity would be his superior. This is not flattery. It is a statement of fact, drawn from observation, contact and work with him.

Of Mr. J. M. Barco are our words equally applicable. Both these men are educated men and thorough going, level headed men of business.

But as we said, there are others, notably such men as B. A. Weathers, Isaac Stevens, J. M. Meffert, Dr. Chace, Hon. W. K. Zewanski, F. E. Harris and B. H. Seymour.

But these are matters for the voter to think about. We mention this fact, for you evidently need to be reminded that an important duty is devolved on you and one in which you as patrons of the school and taxpayers are vitally interested in. Let it have your attention.
