Mr. Mayo was about to open up a new store. This person is reported to be Mr. Samuel David Gray, a young man well known in Ocala, going there, he said, from Syracuse, N. Y., and for over a year was in the employ of P. C. Davis, the Montezuma block barber.

While here, Mr. Gray entered into the social life of the place, became a member of the Ocala Rifles and mingled freely with the young people. Gray possessed a bright mind, had been considerable of a reader of standard works, and in his leisure moments indulged in writing poetry and prose for the local papers, giving his ideas as to what should be done to improve some of the conditions prevailing in Ocala. He was in thought very progressive and often spoke of improvements that could be undertaken in the city that would assist its material interests. During his stay here he made many acquaintances and some friends who thought well of him.

From Ocala Mr. Gray went to Gainesville and embarked in the barber business for himself and seemed very successful, but he felt he had talents that fitted him for a larger field of usefulness, so became traveling salesman for Eagan-Skinner, wholesale grocers, and was a very successful knight of the grip. During this time he married a very estimable young lady at Gainesville. Suddenly he ceased his connection with the Jacksonville grocery firm and embarked in trade at Arredonda, where he remained for about six months, sold out and disappeared, and no more was heard of him until it was learned he had basely imposed on and robbed certain Savannah merchants as already indicated.
